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Interview Description with: Andrew Lamputt

Intro – Knew Derek Evans (DE) when very young – DE and father cricketers. Lamputt's 11 – independently run.

Aged 16/17 made his own dark room – encouraged to go see DE – invited to see what they did – meet Keith and Graham. DE offered work experience. ABC TV or Midlands Today – filming for them. 35mm film – large camera. Took back to Edgar Street and type up narrative – sent by rail to Birmingham to go on TV that night.

FA Cup. As a Mod drove his 70s Lambretta. Sat morning photography course at Art College – SLRs – Rolex, Hasselblad's, 120m film.

Father impressed with self-made dark rooms – DE influence story again. Going out with DE to take stills of vats at Bulmers – industrial photography – Remembers touching up prints of film.

FA Cup – didn't realise the big responsibility of the job at the time – MOD – DE asked AL to take the film from side of pitch (touch line) to get them wired – 2 x runners

DE has assignment from big newspapers in Fleet Street to get pics of the game – needed to be printed in tomorrow's newspapers. Forbade to take any cannisters from people other than DE team. Missed all the goals – in transit with film.

Not paid. Being a Mod – Quadrophenia scooters. So cool. Recap of giant killer match day. And Mod life again. Mods and rockers scene. Used to hang out in pubs. Scooter wheelies down Broad Street. Racehorse pub in Widemarsh Street. Snooker, table tennis. Own wheels and independent. In summer, the Cottage of Content pub. What mods wore. Bought their clothes (individual parka) from Millets. It was all about the loo. Curious mix of youth cultures in Hereford. People didn't take photos of themselves. DE's personality. Friendly, precise and charismatic. Great laugh. Privilege to know. A fantastic person. Smoker's voice.
